Primary 1 Orientation 2019

We welcomed our first Primary 1 cohort on 30 December 2019. There were engaging classroom activities and a school tour for the students, while parents attended a briefing on primary school life.





First Steps

Our first Primary 1 cohort started their journey in Valour Primary School (VPS) on 2 January 2020. Students were introduced to primary school life via the First Steps programme. The programme also acquainted students with safety and school rules, as well as essential school routines such as arrival, recess and dismissal procedures.

They shared good practices to adopt during the COVID-19 crisis, including wearing a mask, washing of hands and staying at home during the circuit breaker and lockdowns.
